Central Indiana IEEE Biofuels Conference

On August 20th, the CIS-IEEE was proud to sponsor the 1st Annual Regional Technical Discourse: "Biofuels in Indiana: Technology, Public Policy and Future Direction". The conference was held at Duke Energy's headquarters, in Plainfield, Indiana. The conference was an all day affair, from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. Over 40 IEEE members and others attended the conference.

Mr. Jim Stanley, President of Duke Energy Indiana introduced the conference. He then spoke on Duke's efforts to promote renewable energy. In particular, he discussed the "fifth fuel" – efficiency. Mr. Stanley then introduced the key note speaker, Senator Beverly Gard, Chair of the Indiana Senate Energy and Environment Committee. In her address, Senator Gard summarized where Indiana stands in a number of biofuels-related areas. Three years ago, the state, despite its agricultural abundance, was far behind in biofuels. Today, Indiana is one of the national leaders in ethanol and soy diesel production. Indiana is also moving forward in putting the infrastructure in place to make biofuels more accessible to the public.

The conference agenda addressed many of the current hot topics in biofuels. However, even a full day is not enough time to cover all aspects of the biofuels issue. One of the goals of the conference was to educate members of the section and the public.
