PES-IAS 2011 Spring News

The CIS-IEEE Power & Energy / Industry Applications Societies have gotten the year off to a good start. Our first presentation was held on January 11. The speaker was Mr. Glen Bertini, CEO of Novinium, a distribution cable technology company from Seattle, Washington. Mr. Bertini's topic was "Solutions to Aging Underground Cable". Mr. Bertini is a well-known expert on cable degradation and on chemical-based means to correct and even reverse degradation. Every utility in the country is facing cable degradation problems, and this lecture discussed the problems faced by utilities and possible solutions. Mr. Bertini was very well spoken and well prepared. Twenty-nine members attended, despite some severe weather conditions. The meeting was held at the Safety Room, Indianapolis Power & Light, 1230 Morris St. Indianapolis, IN. This year the PES-IAS has decided to start its meetings a little earlier to allow time for networking.

The second meeting of the year was held on February 22 (after being postponed from February 8) at IP&L. The speaker was Dr. Maryam Saeedifard, Assistant Professor at Purdue. Her topic was "High Voltage Direct Current Transmission". HVDC lines are becoming more and more common through the world, and have been proposed in a number of locations for transporting renewable energy from remote locations (offshore, High Plains) to load centers. The best known HVDC line in the US is the Pacific DC Intertie, which runs from Portland to Los Angeles. Dr. Saeedifard's talk was also well presented. Twenty-two members attended.




