The PES/IAS/PELS had an active second half of 2014, beginning with its September meeting on utility distribution system <u>Volt-Var Optimization</u>. Speakers from Conrad Technical Services and IP&L addressed how to improve system performance while reducing peak demand and saving energy. The section held a four week fall short course on <u>Variable Frequency Drives</u> taught by industry vendors and one large industrial user. Topics included an introduction of the basic VFD design and operation, history of the devices, presentation of advance functionality from advances in processing, programming, and communication technologies, and finally, how to apply the new technologies in a large industrial facility.

The PES-IAS-PELS plans to hold many educational and informative meetings again in 2015. Anyone interested in serving in a leadership position for the PES-IAS-PELS should review the following vacancies.

PES-IAS-PELS Officer Vacancies

The PES-IAS-PELS Joint Society is in need of volunteers to fill some officer positions. In particular, the following positions need to be filled:

Society Chair – this person will be responsible for the following: attending Section Executive Committee meetings (usually virtual), and coordinating Society activities, and miscellaneous duties, such as representing the Society in IEEE and other meetings. This person will also have a role in organizing Society meetings.

Meeting Coordinator – this person will organize the Society's meetings, in particular the two Short Courses conducted each year. The short course consists of four sessions on a common topic over four consecutive weeks. The Short Course is the leading revenue generator for the PES-IAS-PELS and the Section itself (after the IEEE National Organization rebates).

The Society Chair and the Meeting Coordinator have an opportunity to shape the direction of the Joint Society and the Section. The meetings are a mix of cutting edge topics and refresher courses. Last year, the Society held short courses on Smart Grid Applications, and Variable Frequency Drives, plus seven individual meetings. The PESL-IAS-PELS Joint Society is the largest part of the Central Indiana Section, has the most meetings, and has won several awards in the past. This organization is key to the success of our section. The two positions each require about 5 hours per month (in addition to attending the meetings, which is optional, although typically the Chair introduces meeting speakers).
